# WHAT DOES GOD DEMAND?

Some months, and if I'm being honest, most months I have to be creative in coming up with something to submit for my monthly article in this newsletter.

Occasionally I draw inspiration from something I've recently read or we have an event in the life of the parish or the wider Church on which I can offer commentary. Other times I write about whatever the upcoming season is bringing. But I'm just not feeling particularly inclined to do any of that this month. I wrote an article about Advent last December, the things going on at St. Gregory's have received ample attention, and the most noteworthy event in the life of the Anglican Church is scandal, with the Archbishop of Canterbury offering his resignation. But thankfully (pun intended), I've just prepared my notes for my Thanksgiving homily and it sparked a little bit of reflection, at least enough to provide a paragraph or two for the Chant.

In my homily, which some of you by the time of publishing will have already heard, I talked about how God demands our thanks. Not in a forceful way, like a parent demanding their kid clean their room, but in a more passive way. I explained it like how the performance of a masterpiece demands applause – not because the performers are insisting upon in but because the performance itself deserves it. So, it got me thinking, what other things does God, by virtue of who He is, demand from us. And this can be a delicate thing, because in many ways the church has downplayed the language of obligation and this is conceptually very similar. People don't like being told what they have to do, so to say something is an obligation or is demanded of us can be off-putting. But when it comes to God, there are some absolute expectations from us that we would do well to acknowledge and uphold.

So, the first thing that God demands from us is our worship. And this one is utterly unique because He is the only one worthy of it. Nothing else in our lives is deserving of our worship. Honor, reverence, respect, admiration... sure, but nothing else deserves our worship. And this worship should be an integral part of our lives. It should inform and influence everything else we do.

And because of this, God demands our obedience. But this one is a bit more complex than by virtue of God being God. While that remains true, logic dictates this one as well. It only makes sense for us to be fully obedient to God because God objectively knows what is best for us. Plenty of people demand things of us that may not be the best for us. A boss may demand that we put in hours that lead to the neglect of our families. A loved one may demand some material thing that we simply cannot afford. This happens because people put their own self-interest before others. God on the other hand has nothing but our best interest at heart for one extremely important reason - He loves us infinitely.

And this brings me to the last thing that God demands, our love. Because he is perfect, he loves us perfectly and that kind of love deserves reciprocation. Despite the fact that we cannot love God back to the same degree that he loves us, we can still love him to the best of our ability.

What is ironic is that while God by virtue of his being, demands everything from us, God in his character demands nothing from us. God only desires our love, obedience, and worship. The beauty of free will is that it is our choice to render them to him or not, regardless of whether or not they are deserved. Take some time this Advent season to think of the ways that you are responding to these demands and how that response is forming your Christian walk.
